As you receive this, we are almost a quarter of the way into 2019. It's an old cliché, but time does seem to fly by incredibly quickly.

Increasingly, the world seems a more unsettled place. Whatever your views about Brexit, the uncertainty does not help anyone and the indications are for an initial possibility of price increases as a result of whatever changes occur. There are also likely to be further increases in utility costs after April. For those who are struggling to keep their heads above water at the moment, any cost-of-living increases are unwelcome.

We are also increasingly aware of the number of you who are being moved onto Universal Credit and the potential problems that can cause. We recognise that life can be challenging sometimes and while we have

to insist that your rent is paid regularly, we are always happy to sit down with you and discuss how this can be achieved in a realistic way. Please do get in touch rather than hoping things will just sort themselves out.

We have now completed our second HOLD property (shared ownership for people with long-term disabilities) and have started on site with 31 units of new housing in Yarmouth and Gunville. These will provide much-needed new homes for rent and shared ownership over the next 18 months.

Finally, we hope we can build on the very successful recent Residents' Panel held in Newport, so please keep an eye out for future dates, plus details of exciting future events offered by our Communities Team.

SERVICE CHARGES 2019/2020

WHAT ARE SERVICE CHARGES?

Service charges cover the cost of managing, maintaining, repairing, insuring and providing services to residents beyond the benefit of occupying their own home. These include items such as cleaning, grounds maintenance, communal repair costs, fire equipment servicing, management costs and any other running expenses to the area in which you live. Services will vary according to where you live. You will only be charged if your home benefits from that service. Leaseholders also pay their share of building insurance and the maintenance of the building through the service charge.



- Deliver value for money on your services
- Consult you about any significant changes to your services
- Give you clear information about how your services are managed

HOW ARE SERVICE CHARGES CALCULATED?

Charges normally change in April and we will give you a month's notice of any changes. Estimates are based on spending in previous years, adding projected increases for inflation, plus any changes in spending that we know about for the coming year.


Any surplus or deficit at the end of the year is carried forward and included in the service charge for the following year.


For 2018/19 the actual costs for the year were higher than estimated, causing a deficit. This was due to a combination of higher than anticipated responsive repairs and an increase to the grounds maintenance contract (increased litter picking, weeding and removal of dog fouling) in communal areas, following tenant consultation. Vectis has again absorbed (not passed on to tenants) a proportion of the repair costs in order to minimise service charge increases in 2019/20. The differences on costs are shown on the following charts.

MONITORING SERVICES PROVIDED

The contractors we use to undertake the work are actively managed by our Property Services team and undergo rigorous checking procedures both in terms of cost and level of service.



UNIVERSAL CREDIT – WILL IT AFFECT YOU?

UNIVERSAL CREDIT REPLACES:

- Child Tax Credit
- Housing Benefit
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Working Tax Credit

If you are already claiming these benefits or tax credits you don't need to do anything now. The Department for Work and Pensions will get in touch with you before there are any changes to your benefits or tax credits.

WHO CAN GET UNIVERSAL CREDIT?

You can apply for Universal Credit if you are on a low income or unemployed. You will usually only be able to claim Universal Credit if you are aged 18 or over, but some people aged 16 or 17 can get it, depending on their circumstances. You usually won't be able to claim Universal Credit if you're in full-time education or training, but people with certain circumstances can still apply. You also can't claim Universal Credit if you are getting the severe disability premium, or if you received it within the last month and are still eligible for it.

HOW IS UNIVERSAL CREDIT PAID?

Universal Credit is a single payment that is paid monthly (normally paid directly into an account in your name) although you may have to wait for around 5 weeks for your first payment. You may be able to get a Universal Credit advance if you are unable to manage during this period.

UNIVERSAL CREDIT AND YOUR RENT

Please remember that once on Universal Credit you will no longer receive Housing Benefit and will be responsible for paying your full rent from your monthly Universal Credit payment. You also need to tell the Department for Work and Pensions about any changes to your rent when rents change each April.

VECTIS TENANTS' PROJECT FUND

Vectis Tenants' Project Fund - funds and delivers small-scale projects that make a lasting and noticeable improvement to your scheme.

At Vectis, we are committed to improving not just the homes of our tenants, but also their quality of life. The Tenants' Project Fund supports and funds projects and improvement works that genuinely make a difference to the lives of our tenants, and the neighbourhoods or schemes in which they live.

Any funding awarded is approved by the Vectis Residents' Panel, which is made up of residents supported by the Vectis Management Team.

Neighbours living in any scheme or neighbourhood can apply to the Tenants' Project Fund if they have a project in mind, which meets any of the following criteria:



Life Skills - example: better access to training and development

Health & Wellbeing - promoting community/leisure activities that bring neighbours together and decrease isolation

Stronger Communities - communities working together to tackle issues in their community such as anti-social behaviour through community events and small-scale interventions such as new fencing or improving security and lighting etc.

Improving our Neighbourhood Environments - improving our environments such as community gardens, installing benches or improving seating areas

NEW HOMES UPDATE FROM THE DEVELOPMENT TEAM

NEW HOUSING CURRENTLY BEING BUILT IN NEWPORT AND BOULDNOR

A key aim of Vectis Housing's Business Strategy is to increase the number of properties it owns or manages, to help satisfy the growing demand for affordable housing on the Isle of Wight. Working closely with a number of developers and builders, we have a potential development pipeline of around 250 new homes that could be built over the next five years. As a result of factors that are beyond our control, including Brexit and the overall housing market, not all of these may be built, however, we are aiming to increase the number of houses we manage by at least 50%.

Currently, we are "on site" with 31 new homes being built across two sites; one in Newport and the other near Yarmouth. These will deliver a mix of one, two and three bedroom houses and flats for rent and shared ownership.

Subject to programme, these are due to be completed towards the end of 2019 and early 2020 and will provide much needed energy efficient homes that have been built to the latest standards.

As construction progresses, we will provide further details.



HAPPY EASTER



Most of us associate Easter with a nice Bank Holiday and plenty of chocolate eggs, however Easter is an important event in the Christian calendar.

Holy Week is the annual Christian observance commemorating Jesus' last week on earth and the events leading up to his resurrection on Easter Sunday. It is also the final week of Lent. Lent is

a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencten, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter for Christians. It is a time of self-examination and reflection where people focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

The dates of Holy Week are defined by the date of Easter Sunday and therefore it falls on different dates from year to year. Holy Week commences on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday. It includes the Christian observances and solemn holidays of Holy Thursday (Maundy Thursday) and Holy Friday (Good Friday).

EGGS AND CHICKS

Turning to the tradition of eating Easter Eggs - these are now often the main thing that people think of if you say Easter. Having eggs to eat at Easter, comes from the middle ages in Europe. During Lent, in the 40 days before Easter, most people took part in a fast and didn't eat certain foods, including dairy items like milk and eggs. Therefore, eggs would have been a real treat to eat at Easter when the fast was over.



Eggs were also used by the ancient Persians and Egyptians to celebrate New Year, which happened for them in spring time. The eggs were coloured and eaten during the celebrations.

In Europe since the 13th century, coloured eggs have used to celebrate Easter as house decorations.

In Eastern European countries, wooden eggs are beautifully painted in lots of different patterns. The patterns often have special names and meanings and help to tell the Easter Story.

The free exhibition runs until Saturday 20th April in the West Gallery upstairs at Quay Arts.








